When an argument relies heavily on a study or research, always look for an option that exposes a bias, flawed methodology, or vested interest in that study. This is a classic critical reasoning pattern.

Common Pitfall

Choosing an option that offers an alternative solution (like diet and exercise) rather than attacking the argument's own logic and evidence.

Common Pitfall

Once you identify Statement II as disastrous for long-term sustainability, you can instantly eliminate options (b), (c), and (e). Between (a) and (d), notice that Statement I is an essential PR solution for false allegations, making (a) the only complete answer.

Common Pitfall

Choosing options that offer a quick superficial fix (like dropping prices or aggressive marketing) but completely ignore the underlying systemic issues (product quality and actual environmental impact).
